We will be staying at the Hampton Inn, Alexandria, VA. The hotel is located at 1616 King Street, Alexandria Old Town – King Street Metro. We will be sleeping segregated adult/youth in double hotel rooms sharing double beds. The hotel phones have voice mail capabilities. Any messages should be left with Glenn or Bud. All drinks brought from home shall be in a plastic bottle with a screw lid.

Do not bring expensive electronics of junk you don't need.

Strict rules on base will be followed. Any scout not following rules will participate and their parents will come to Washington to pick them up at their expense.

Scouts will be expected to wear complete as possible Class "A" uniforms in public with Troop 320 hats. This is mandatory. They will be expected to behave and act in a scout like manner. If the scout does not feel they can conduct themselves according to troop rules then they should stay home.

After we return to the farm at 3:00 on Thursday April 1, scouts left at Glenn's house will be washing the vans and working.

This trip is educational. Any scouts that need permission to miss school will be provided with a letter from the Scoutmaster outlining the trip and iterating the benefits of making the trip and will be provided upon request.

Scouts will be expected to shower every day and keep their dress neat and clean. We will have a method of washing scout shirts during the week. Washington DC can be very cool this time of year. We recommend scout wear clothing in layers with scout uniform on outside. In many areas, book bags are prohibited as well as anything that can be considered a weapon.
